



Median After-Tax Income of Census Families, 2021

Released by Statistics Canada – August 9, 2023

In 2021, the median after-tax income (in 2021 constant dollars) of Census families in Yukon was \$73,760. Compared to the 2020 figure (\$73,930 in 2021 constant dollars), the 2021 median after-tax income of Census families in Yukon decreased by \$170, or 0.2%. Compared to the 2017 figure (\$68,950 in 2021 constant dollars), the 2021 median after-tax income of Census families in Yukon increased by \$4,810, or 7.0%.

In 2021, Yukon Census families had the second highest median after-tax income (\$73,760) of all provinces and territories following the Northwest Territories (\$80,820).

The 2021 median after-tax income of Yukon Census families was \$14,460, or 24.4%, higher than the national figure (\$59,300).

Note to readers:

- All values represent 2021 constant dollars.
- After-tax income refers to total income less income taxes. The median is the point at which half of the observations are higher and half are lower.
- A census family refers to a married or a common-law couple, with or without children at home, or a lone-parent family.
